Dear Friends,

The season of Epiphany is upon us — a season that reaffirms the love of God for his Son and for the whole of creation. At Jesus' baptism God delights in what he sees: "This is my beloved Son." All this will help us as we live, post pandemic, the Ely 2025 strategy so we can Engage, Grow, Deepen as the generous and visible people of Jesus Christ we pray to be in the years to come.
