Timeline of Project so far:

- Early 2020 As part of Eco Church and Caring for God's Acre initiatives:
 - Approach made to Conservationist
 - Paul Hardy asked to produce a map to assist with a habitat survey
 - Spring assessment of the site
 - Identification of an area which could remain uncut
- March 2021 Environments/Biodiversity Project Report including a record of all plants
- May 2021 Diana Cook invited to visit
- May 2021 Steering Committee formed
- May 2021 Map revised to reflect agreed compartments
- May 2021 Mowing regime established

July 2021 Community invited to attend a walk and talk

 October 2021 Autumn tidy including the planting/sowing of some native species in the Spring Meadow and Woodland areas

Challenges

- People have different views on what churchyards should look like
- For some, the uncut areas can look scruffy and unmanaged
- Need to be respectful to those who visit loved one's graves
- Cost implications to change mowing regime
- Need to make sure only native species are intoduced

Benefits

- Improvement to the biodiversity of the area
- Opportunity to engage with the wider community
- Present a pleasant place for people to visit as well as the building
