Where do I stand?

- National & international life I support keeping social issues high on the agenda of Synod, especially those highlighted by Covid. Often Synod is at its best when it is looking outward, especially at a time of acute social upheaval in our nation and international tension.

- I bring the experience of 39 years of ministry to help contribute to the debates and decisions of Synod.
- I have energy and commitment and a strong desire to make the link between General Synod and the Diocese work.
